

IOM Definition of Prevention

 Interventions that occur prior to the onset of a disorder and are intended to prevent or reduce the risk of the disorder

- Community Based Process
- Environmental Approaches

For Individuals

- InformationDissemination
- PreventionEducation
- PositiveAlternatives

For Communities

- Environmental Strategies
- Community based processes
- Identification of problems and referral to services



Why include environmental strategies?

- Reach the greater population/community
- Create both short and long-term change
- Support/Enhance the impact of individual strategies
- Inexpensive and easy to maintain

Education

- Education of individuals
 - Youth, families, adults, professionals
 - Across the lifespan
 - · Should be a coordinated, prioritized effort in a community
- Education of communities
 - Will reinforce prevention messages taught to individuals
 - Will change community norms



Education

- Individual Education
 - Physician/prescriber training on best practices for opioid prescribing and dosing guidelines
 - National Registry of Evidence Based Programs and Practices
 - To find evidence based curriculums designed to prevent addictive behaviors
- Community Awareness Campaigns
 - Highlight local data
 - Correct myths and misunderstandings
 - Showcase community resources
 - Spotlight community prevention resources
 - Teach appropriate medication practices: monitor, secure and safely dispose
 - Generation Rx
 - PhARMING Effect



Tracking and monitoring

- Helps detect "doctor shoppers"
- Identifies prescribers who have inappropriate prescribing practices
- OARRS Ohio Automated Rx Reporting System



Proper medication disposal

• Provides opportunities for people to safely and responsibly get rid of controlled substances they have in their households.

Harm Reduction

- Not designed to prevent drug use
- Designed to reduce death, disability and other negative consequences associated with prescription drug misuse and overdose



Multicomponent programs

• Combine multiple strategies to address the various factors that influence prescription drug and opiate misuse and abuse.



Today, you can prevent opiate misuse

Utilize safe medication practices:

- Monitor, secure and safely dispose of medications
