

Backlash is more than sharp critique, resistance, disregard, repudiation, or even coercion.

Can be both lawful and legitimate even if contested.
But some things cross the line.

Persuasion

Can challenge even sacred assumptions and create discomfort without being disrespectful, uncivil, unproductive. Tactics range from innocuous to more provocative.

 Reactive to perceived loss of status or power (and often involves identity-based targeting & attack) and suggests the need for punishment





Extreme Coercion

Dog feces left in a box at front door along with a DEATH THREAT COMPOSED WITH LETTERS CUT & PASTED FROM A NEWSPAPER. This health official also had a physical encounter in public.

"IP eople are spitting in our faces, you know, and shouting us down" at a public meeting.

"You know we're coming to get you. We will not stand for this."

Identity-Based

"I walk up [to speak] and the crowd is hissing and jeering at me by this time. [The elected official's] opening question to me was, 'Are you a doctor from the United States? Why should we call you a doctor?' ... That question was designed to throw red meat to the hostile crowd behind me. ... That's when the racial abuse began. 'You effing quack. You effing liar. You tyrant. You ain't even a real doctor. Go the eff back to where you came from.' They began mocking my accent using the Apu voice from The Simpsons."

Multiple sexualized (rape and dismemberment) death threats (hanging) and stalking from a known individual convicted of domestic violence. One death threat included an image of a toddler being strangled with the warning:

"I know where your kid goes to school."

You need to be "strung up" and "electrocution would be too good for you."

Not all coercion, soft or extreme, rises to the level of backlash.

After face-to-face press conference "some guy followed me back to the the city car and was like spitting at me and telling me that my family needs get Covid and die."

"If this goes south, I'm going to hold you accountable," accompanied with a threat to lynch or shoot this female health official.



Younger = <50 , Older = 50+


