Collective Expertise


By leveraging expertise, resources and workforce across sectors, we can optimize impact and increase efficiencies and effectiveness.

# Transforming (re)Accreditation: Feedback from the Field





#### **Multifaceted engagements**

- Survey outreach
- All HD calls and input sessions
- Board committee engagements
- 1:1 meetings with HD leadership



#### **Themes**

- Appreciation for clear communication and flexibility
- Budget constraints are limiting capacity to continue (re)accreditation journey
- Reaccreditation activities feel misaligned with day-to-day realities
- The ability to articulate accreditation's value and ROI is essential

# Flexibility and Relevance

Reflecting real-time public health priorities as defined by the HD grounded in FPHS

# Reduce Documentation Burden

Overall reduction in documentation required and moves some from docs to visual observation

#### Continuous Improvement

Increased touch points between cycles with connection to resources and TA

# **Increasing Benefits**

Add new benefits for accredited HDs that are within PHAB's control





#### Reaccreditation Components



#### **Focused Narratives**

Reduced documentation burden

Allow HDs to demonstrate conformity with examples

Leverage content to support other reporting requirement



#### **Enhanced Site Visits**

Pre-Site Visit Conversation to initial assessment and open measures
